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In The Beginning.....

In these few pages I'm going to try to bring you, the reader, through a radical change in the way you believe that the World functions. If I succeed then you are going to permanently move yourself into constant abundance both materially and in all other aspects of your life. If I don't, then I wish you a better teacher tomorrow.

First we need to give a little background to how things got the way they are. I know that I am writing this for many different nationalities and cultures. Some things may, therefore, seem strange to you but everyday reality for someone else. Just take it in your stride and ignore those that aren't for you.

Also, as part of the introduction, I would ask you to note that what I am going to relate here is precisely what I have done to move from having no income in May of this year to having \$29599,31 tax paid in my bank accounts on the 13th of October!

The catalyst which started this process was Joe Vitale's book "The Attractor Factor". if you haven't read it, go get it now! The first thing it did for me was to open my eyes to the fact that I had things literally lying around in my computer which people had been asking me for for years. I quickly put it together into a course and, to date, it has made me almost \$5000.00. Not a lot of money in five months but I didn't have to do very much because it was already there, **I simply hadn't noticed because my programming was somewhere else.** That is what this is all about - changing your programming so that you notice all your opportunities and stop noticing all the rationalisations for not using them.

It's that simple.

The truth is that you already have access everything you want, you've just been trained to not notice it. That's why you think it's difficult to get it!

The Real Problem

Throughout recent history, i.e. the last 2500 years or so, mankind has made repeated attempts to develop some means of guaranteeing a life of ease and pleasure. None of them have really worked because they are based upon the premise that some "thing" out there is deliberately holding me down and it must be either conquered or appeased. This belief system is contrary to fact. There is nothing "out there" holding you back.

What there is, is the misguided attempt to impose peace by force (whilst, at the same time, not noticing that this is, in itself, a contradiction opposing peace). These are the activities of the various priesthoods throughout the World preaching, in one form or another, that God "requires" your obedience to me, i.e. your well-being is at my disposal, not yours!

The reactions to this have been interesting.

"Black magic" is the attempt to conquer this "God" who denies me health and wealth, by the use of psychic power. The only reason it doesn't work is that this "Denying God" is within you, not outside!

The various power structures, i.e. the large commercial and/or military interests have, also, as their foundation the belief that there is an external, denying force which has to be overcome.

The offering of "sacrifices" to this "God" to appease him/her and so to, at least, ensure your survival. If you perform the ritual very correctly then you may even become richer (only after having first made the priest richer you will note!) Oddly enough, there is actually a small grain of truth in this rigmarole but it is highly camouflaged so as to provide a "profession" for the priesthood. It is simply this:

As ye sow, so shall ye reap. I know that this is normally expressed as a warning and threat of "punishment" but it is actually a correct statement of how the World really works. If you believe, i.e. sow a

seed, that you are poor then this is what you will experience, i.e. reap. Conversely, if you know that you are wealthy then this is what you will harvest.

Now, you and your forebears (me and mine as well) have been taught for many, many generations that it is, in some manner, holy to be poor and powerless. ("It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter heaven." It is, therefore, the "Will of Heaven" that you be poor, for example: i.e. it is evil to be rich) These are the basic assumptions about life with which you were surrounded right from the moment of conception and throughout your childhood. Is it any wonder that you run your life on "autopilot" based on this programming?

Very few of mankind's basic assumptions about life are based upon truth or reality. A belief system which is not based upon truth, i.e. has no real roots, is actually quite easy to remove. When you remove the nonsense, all that remains is truth. Actions, especially unconscious "automatic" actions based on truth both work and are life affirming.

A couple of years ago I read of someone who had managed to amass a personal fortune of \$30 billion. Sounds good, yes? Well, just think about it for a minute. What on Earth can he do with it? What can one buy which costs even a small fraction of this huge sum of money? Was he happy? No way. He was a prisoner of his gold and felt that he had to take vengeance against the World for imposing this enormous load upon him!

How can such a thing happen?

In order for one person to have so much money, many others must deny themselves the wealth which is their birthright. Your money has got to go somewhere and if you keep on rejecting it then it will end up torturing someone to whom it does not belong!

It's all about balance. Neither extreme wealth nor poverty have anything to do with "Divine Order". The rich man has difficulty finding the Doorway to Heaven, i.e. peace and happiness because

he is a prisoner of his money. Similarly, the poor man has no time to look to Heaven because his whole attention is centred upon mere survival.

One can even go further and state, without fear of contradiction, that all wars are caused by the belief that someone has taken away my wealth and that I must fight to get it back.

Updating your Life's Operating System

The interesting thing about this nonsense is that you don't have to learn anything new to overcome it, you "just" have to forget it.

Perhaps this is easier to grasp in computer terms. To improve your basic system performance, you delete Windows 98 and install Windows XP. That's what we're talking about - giving your life a new operating system.

The analogy is, of course, not quite accurate but I hope that you can see where we're heading.

The reality is, in one way, simpler and, in another, a little more difficult.

It is simpler in the sense that the operating system you actually want is already there installed just, mostly, not switched on. By always choosing the one you really want the other will just evaporate. Would that it were really so simple.

I have a quotation from an "enlightened master" on this point:
"Take a little time to study your thoughts. It is work which will bring you great rewards. Only a little time is necessary. Forty years should be entirely sufficient"

But really, what do the actual structures look like?

There is the natural, intuitive impulse to do something which serves you and, thereby, brings happiness to you and to all around you. This comes from the OS you really want. Overlaying this are the programmes from the OS you don't want; the instructions which say, "you don't deserve this, you must suffer for others, it is "wrong" to be abundant, you must live the life of a victim to get

into Heaven, there's not enough for you to have a share etc., ad. nauseum, et. al.. This is the crap that you want to get rid of.

So how?
